



Whether you're a first-time guest or a seasoned museum-goer, we hope every visit to the MOA is inspiring. To help you have a safe and fulfilling experience, here are a few useful tips.



All artwork is a touch-free, hands-free experience. Please maintain a minimum of 18 inches distance between you and any artworks.



To preserve the condition of the art, backpacks are not allowed in the galleries.



Food and drink are not permitted in the galleries. Food and drink from the MOA Café must remain in the Café.



Personal use non-flash photography and video from phones is acceptable unless otherwise indicated (tag us in your photos!). SLR cameras, tripods, selfie-sticks, and other stabilizing equipment are NOT permitted without previous written consent from the Museum marketing team (visit our website for details).



Sketching in the galleries is not permitted without prior approval from the Registration Department.



We love when families with children visit the museum! Parents and caregivers—please keep an eye on your little ones so they don't get lost...or so lost in the artwork that they accidentally touch it.



Firearms and weapons are prohibited on BYU campus, including the Museum of Art.



Animals are not permitted in the museum with the exception of trained service dogs.
